

**EXECUTIVE ORDER**

**2020-03**

**March 30 2020**

**Declaration of State of Emergency**

**Town of Narragansett**

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020 the World Health Organization designated the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern;

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020 the Rhode Island Department of Health established an Incident Command System response to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020 the United States Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar III declared a public health emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020 the State of Rhode Island Governor Gina M. Raimondo issued Executive Order 20-02 declaring a state of emergency due to the outbreak of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, Governor Gina M. Raimondo subsequently issued the following Executive Orders:

Executive Order 20-03 containing a supplemental emergency declaration dated March 13, 2020;

Executive Order 20-04 containing a second supplemental emergency declaration regarding restaurants, bars, entertainment venues and public gatherings dated March 16, 2020;

Executive Order 20-05 containing a third supplemental emergency declaration regarding public meetings and public records requests dated March 16, 2020;

Executive Order 20-06 pertaining to expanding access to telemedicine services dated March 18, 2020;

Executive Order 20-07 pertaining to weapon and firearm background checks dated March 20, 2020;

Executive Order 20-08 pertaining to restaurants, bars and establishments that offer food dated March 20, 2020;

Executive Order 20-09 pertaining to public gatherings, close-contact businesses, public recreation and business service providers dated March 22, 2020;

Executive Order 20-10 pertaining to quarantine restrictions on domestic air travelers dated March 23, 2020;

Executive Order 20-11 pertaining to delaying the primary elections and preparing a predominantly mail ballot election dated March 23, 2020;

Executive Order 20-12 - Tenth Supplemental Emergency Declaration – Quarantine Restrictions on Travelers from New York State dated March 26, 2020;

Executive Order 20-13 - Eleventh Supplemental Emergency Declaration – Staying At Home, Reducing Gatherings, Certain Retail Business Closures and Further Quarantine Provisions dated March 28, 2020;

Executive Order 20-14 - Amended Eleventh Supplemental Emergency Declaration – Staying At Home, Reducing Gatherings, Certain Retail Business Closures and Further Quarantine Provisions dated March 28, 2020

Executive Order 20-15 - Twelfth Supplemental Emergency Declaration – Extension of Executive Orders on the Operation of Food Establishments and Close Contact Businesses dated March 20, 2020

WHEREAS, such additional Executive Orders may be issued, or the aforementioned amended, extended or rescinded;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of COVID-19 to be a Pandemic;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the President of the United States addressed the nation about the threat posed by the outbreak of COVID-19 and announced a restriction on international air travel from 26 European nations for a period of thirty days starting on March 12, 2020;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020 the United States State Department issued an extraordinary global health advisory;

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020 the outbreak of COVID-19 has spread to every continent except Antarctica and infected more than 690,000 people, causing approximately more than 33,000 deaths worldwide based on the World Health Organization data;

WHEREAS, the number of countries that are experiencing community transmission of COVID-19 continues to grow;

WHEREAS, community transmission in the United States has occurred in every state, plus Washington, D.C., and three U.S. territories, and is an immediate public health threat to the elderly and those with underlying health conditions;

WHEREAS, four hundred eight (408) cases of COVID-19 have been documented in the State of Rhode Island as of March 30, 2020;

WHEREAS, the State of Rhode Island and various public health officials have reached out to the Town of Narragansett to take steps to contain the spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the Town of Narragansett needs to take additional measures to limit the spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, Rhode Island General Laws §§ 30-15-12 and 30-15-13, as well as the Town of Narragansett Code of Ordinances and Home Rule Charter § 2-1-7 and §2-1-9, permit the Town Council to declare a state of emergency for the purpose of, among other things: providing for the cooperation in epidemic prevention, preparedness, response and recovery; preparing for emergency health threats that require the exercise of extraordinary governmental functions; providing the Town with the ability to respond rapidly and effectively to potential or actual public health emergencies; and reducing loss of life;

WHEREAS, Rhode Island General Laws § 30-15-9 and §30-15-12, as well as the Town of Narragansett Code of Ordinances and Home Rule Charter § 2-1-7 and § 2-1-9, permit the Town Council to suspend the provisions of any statute, regulation, or requirement prescribing the procedures for the conduct of Town business, or the orders, rules, regulations of any Town department, board, or agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of any statute, order, rule or regulation would in any way prevent, hinder or delay necessary action in coping with this emergency; and

WHEREAS, Rhode Island General Laws §§ 30-15-9 and 30-15-12, as well as the Town of Narragansett Code of Ordinances and Home Rule Charter § 2-1-7 and § 2-1-9, permit the Town Council to transfer the direction, personnel, or functions of Town departments and agencies or units thereof for the purpose of performing or facilitating emergency services; to control ingress and egress to and from high risk areas, the movement of persons within the area, and the occupancy of premises therein; and to take appropriate measures for the protection of health, safety, and welfare of the people of the Town and to prevent or minimize the loss of life.

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Narragansett Town Council, by virtue of the authority vested in our body as the Town Council of the Town of Narragansett, pursuant to the Rhode Island General Laws and the Town of Narragansett Code of Ordinances and Home Rule Charter, including but not limited to Title 30, Chapter 15 of the General Laws and Chapter § 2-1-7 and § 2-1-9 of the Town of Narragansett Code of Ordinances and Home Rule Charter, do hereby order and direct the following:


1. A state of emergency is hereby declared for the Town of Narragansett due to the dangers to health and life posed by COVID-19, and the Town's disaster emergency plan is hereby activated.
2. The Town Emergency Management Agency Director is directed to activate the Town's emergency operations center and all necessary Town emergency response plans, policies, compacts, and agreements, to create and establish mobile support units, and to activate and deploy disaster response teams and disaster response workers to perform disaster response services.

3. All Town departments, agencies, or quasi-municipal agencies and boards and commissions performing executive functions shall cooperate fully with the Rhode Island Emergency Management Agency (RIEMA) and Narragansett Emergency Management Agency in all matters concerning this Order. Efforts to provide emergency disaster relief to the Town of Narragansett should be coordinated by and through the Narragansett Emergency Management Agency.
4. All entertainment licenses and special event permits, whether for night clubs, concerts, live music, or other events, are hereby revoked during the period of this state of emergency. The Town will not be issuing any entertainment licenses or special event permits during the period of this state of emergency.
5. Bars, restaurants or establishments within the borders of the Town that offer food or drink shall not permit on premises consumption of food or drink provided that such establishments may continue to offer food and alcoholic beverages, limited to two (2) bottles of wine and 144 ounces of beer in original factory sealed containers, with take-out food orders, provided that such sales shall be made in accordance with 1.4.10 of the Department of Business Regulation Liquor Control Administration Regulations, 230-RICR-30-10-1, and all takeout and delivery will be in accordance with social distancing protocols and guidance set forth by RIDOH, in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders 20-04 and 20-08.
6. Public gatherings of more than 5 people are hereby prohibited in Narragansett. Gatherings subject to this Order include, but are not limited to, community, civic, leisure, or faith based events, sporting events with spectators, concerts, conventions, fundraisers, parades, fairs, festivals, and any other similar activity that brings together more than five (5) people at the same time, in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 20-14.
7. All public recreation and entertainment establishments shall cease in-person operations. Public recreation and entertainment establishments subject to this Order include, but are not limited to, theaters, cinemas, sporting events, bowling alleys, concert venues, museums and zoos, in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 20-09.
8. All close contact businesses (businesses which cannot maintain social distancing with their customers) including, but not limited to, gymnasiums, fitness centers and similar exercise facilities, hair salons and barber shops, nail salons, spas and tattoo parlors shall cease in-person operations, in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 20-09
9. Town officials are directed to cancel all non-essential official Town meetings, limit the travel of Town employees, and postpone all public events during the period of this state emergency.
10. All Town offices and operations shall otherwise remain open until further notice and shall continue to otherwise operate in their ordinary course of business. Staff that has been identified as being able to work remotely are required to do so to limit the number of staff in the Town offices. Local businesses are encouraged to follow suit in allowing eligible employees to work remotely, in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 20-09.
11. All visitors, residents and seasonal residents residing in the Town of Narragansett arriving from out of state and/or areas of high concentration of COVID-19 or those areas where the

person was previously subject to a “Shelter in Place Order”, in an effort to prevent COVID-19 community spread, are directed to self-quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days. This is in response to Governor Gina Raimondo’s directive that all Rhode Islanders flying into the state are required to self-quarantine to reduce the spread of the COVID-19 / coronavirus. The term “Self-Quarantine” means to remain at your residence except for medical care or emergencies. Self-Quarantine includes having food and other necessities delivered to the residence rather than leaving the residence to obtain such food/necessities. Persons under Self-Quarantine must monitor for symptoms such as fever, cough and shortness of breath.

12. All non-critical retail businesses shall cease in-person operations. Critical retail businesses include, but are not limited to, food and beverage stores (e.g., supermarkets, liquor, specialty food, and convenience stores, farmers’ markets, food banks and pantries), pharmacies and medical supply stores, compassion centers, pet supply stores, printing shops, mail and delivery stores and operations, gas stations, laundromats, electronics and telecommunications stores, office supply, industrial and agricultural/seafood equipment and supply stores, hardware stores, funeral homes, auto repair and supply, banks and credit unions, firearms stores, healthcare and public safety professional uniform stores, and other stores and businesses identified as critical by the Department of Business Regulation. Restaurants will be permitted to operate only for pickup, drive-through, and delivery in accordance with previous executive orders.
13. Pursuant to the emergency powers granted by the Rhode Island General Laws, and any other applicable provisions of state or local law, I shall from time to time issue additional directives, orders, and recommendations as circumstances require, either written or verbal.
14. Nothing in this Executive Order shall constrain the duties and powers of the Town, the Town Manager, the Town Council, or the Emergency Management Agency authorized by Title 30, Chapter 15 of the General Laws and the Town of Narragansett Code of Ordinances and Home Rule Charter § 2-1-7 and § 2-1-9 *et seq.*
15. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and remain in full force and effect until April 13, 2020, unless renewed, modified or terminated by a subsequent Executive Order. This order supersedes Town of Narragansett Executive Order 20-02 in its entirety and requires compliance with all components of Executive Orders 20-02 thru 20-15, inclusive, issued by the Honorable Governor Gina Raimondo.
