LOCAL REFERENDUM

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2022

Voter fraud is a felony. Every person who is convicted of voter fraud shall be imprisoned for a term of not more than ten (10) years, or fined not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) nor more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or both, for each offense. You must be registered to vote from your actual place of residence.

Explanation: Per amendment to the Narragansett Home Rule Charter in 2020, Section 1-3-1 entitled, “Powers of town”, the Town of Narragansett “only may sell property only after approval from the town’s voters after being submitted to the electorate on referendum ballot at the next scheduled election.” The way the Charter reads all property, not just real estate or land, must be put before the voters. This question allows the voters to decide if the Town of Narragansett may sell miscellaneous surplus property including but not limited to property identified in the list, but excluding all Town owned buildings, Town owned real property, and Town owned real estate.
