***Voter fraud is a felony, the penalty for which is imprisonment for a term of not more than ten (10) years, or fine not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) nor more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or both, for each offense. You must be registered to vote from your actual place of residence.***

Notice is hereby given to the electors to appear at the following polling places on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 to vote in said Districts (all in said Town of Narragansett) for the General Election:

To vote in said districts for the following for the next ensuing term:

One Representative to represent the Second Congressional District of Rhode Island in the Congress of the United States; One Senator from the 36<sup>th</sup> Senatorial District, One Representative from the 33<sup>rd</sup> Representative District and One Representative from the 34<sup>th</sup> Representative District to represent the Town of Narragansett in the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island.

**QUESTIONS 1 – 3**  
(Chapter 231 Public Laws 2022)

Shall the action of the General Assembly, by an act passed at the January 2022 session, authorizing the issuance of bonds, refunding bonds, and temporary notes of the State of Rhode Island for the capital projects and in the amount with respect to each such project listed below (Questions 1-3) be approved, and the issuance of bonds, refunding bonds, and temporary notes authorized in accordance with the provisions of said act?

**1. UNIVERSITY OF RHODE ISLAND NARRAGANSETT BAY CAMPUS - \$100,000,000**

For repairs and to construct new facilities on the University of Rhode Island's Narragansett Bay Campus in support of the educational and research needs for the marine disciplines.

**2. RHODE ISLAND SCHOOL BUILDINGS - \$250,000,000**

To provide funding for the construction, renovation, and rehabilitation of the state's public schools.

For environmental and recreational purposes, to be allocated as follows:

- a. Municipal Resiliency- \$16,000,000
- b. Small Business Energy Loan Program - \$5,000,00

- d. Forest Restoration - \$3,000,000
- e. Brownfields Remediation and Economic Development - \$4,000,000
- f. State Land Acquisition Program - \$3,000,000
- g. Local Land Acquisition Matching Grant Program - \$2,000,000
- h. Local Recreation Development Matching Grant Program - \$2,000,000
- i. Roger Williams Park and Zoo - \$12,000,000

Shall an act, passed at the 2022 session of the General Assembly, entitled "An act authorizing the Town of Narragansett to finance the improvement, replacement, construction, renovation, repair, reconstruction and/or restoration of roadways, sidewalks, storm drains, public buildings and other public infrastructure in the Town of Narragansett and to issue not more than \$20,000,000 bonds and notes therefor" be approved?
