In 2018, which was an election year, the Board of Canvassers held seven (7) meetings. Attached is the attendance record of those meetings.

The Primary Election was held on Wednesday, September 12, 2018 at the following five (5) polling locations: North Beach Clubhouse, Mettatuxet Yacht Club, St. Veronica Chapel, Narragansett Pier School and St. Mary's Star of the Sea Church. The Board conducted the usual election business of filing declaration papers, certifying nomination papers, certifying voting list and mail ballots, as well as manual counts, provisional ballots, and final primary results.

The General Election was held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, at the same five (5) polling places as the Primary Election. The Board conducted the usual election business of certifying voting list and mail ballots, as well as manual count, write-in ballots, provisional ballots and the final election results

OVERVIEW

The mission statement of the Narragansett Conservation Commission (NCC) is to provide a legacy by enhancing natural aesthetic areas, protecting watersheds and promoting public awareness in the conservation of all natural resources, improving the quality of life both in the present and for the future.

The Narragansett Conservation Commission is a Town advisory body providing conservation recommendations pertinent to the Town Council. The Conservation Commission also oversees the Town of Narragansett's Adopt-A-Spot Program and has provided significant input on conservation aspects of proposed large multi-unit developments in town.

HIGHLIGHTS

The 2018 Town Conservation Commission was comprised of 7 members with an annual budget of \$500.00.

The Narragansett Conservation Commission is a member of the Rhode Island Association of Conservation Commissions (RIACC). It is a non-profit, grassroots organization devoted to fostering cooperation and coordination among municipal conservation commissions on a regional and statewide basis.

The Commission continued to work on the single use plastic bag ban by reviewing Ordinances from other Towns as well as discussing possible next steps. In 2019, the Commission will hold a public workshop with local businesses and residents to discuss the potential ban and glean feedback that will inform a potential new ordinance.

In June of 2018, the Town Council approved a \$10,000 increase in the Commission budget for the tree planting program. The Commission has been working to generate interest from local property owners who may want to participate. Planting will begin in the spring of 2019.

Reviewed and provided advisory commentary on the following projects:

Clarke Road Subdivision – The Commission provide an advisory opinion on a 5-lot subdivision on Clarke Road. Approximately 44% of the subject parcel is wetland/swamp area.

Middlebridge Management Land - The Commission provided an advisory opinion on the Middlebridge Management Plan that was created by the Land Conservancy Trust.

Elpus Landscape Plan – The Commission provided an opinion of the Landscape Plan for the Planning Board to address violations of a Zoning Decision.

Sunset Blvd South – 5-lot Subdivision – The Commission discussed the 5-lot subdivision proposed on Sunset Blvd.

5-Points Estates 5-lot Subdivision The Commission discussed the 5-lot subdivision proposed on Old Boston Neck Road.

ADOPT-A-SPOT

No additional progress was made on the Adopt-a-spot program in 2018. The Commission will be revisiting the program and seeking new adopters in 2019.

It is because of this that the RI CRMC holds the Town of Narragansett's HMP up as a road map for other Rhode Island towns to follow while they work on their individual harbor management plans.

Attendance of the members of this commission is exemplary, with absolutely zero problems with unexcused absences; even excused absences are too few to mention. It is evident that our members enjoy what they are doing and we always have a quorum.

I am pleased to report that the Narragansett Harbor Commission has had a very productive 2018 year and pursuant to the Narragansett Code of Ordinances :

Sec: 82-128 (9) **Additional powers and duties**

To review and make recommendations on proposed water use activities contiguous to the waterfront, and in the waters within the jurisdiction of the town that are received for review by other municipal agencies

We as a body have reviewed several dock applications to ensure that they would not interfere with Town Right of Ways, Fairways or Mooring Fields.

We work closely our Harbormaster to stay on top of all situations that involve our Towns waterways – the Harbor Commission has an outstanding working relationship with our Harbormaster, Kevin Connors, he is doing an outstanding job for the Town.

We have moved on to projects we hope to move forward over the next few years.

- 1) a plan for a public/private partnership to create transient moorings inviting boaters to visit our town and our local businesses.
- 2) we are currently studying the use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides in our waters.
- 3) a plan to study oyster reef restoration in Point Judith Pond has been implemented by RIDEM and our wish to open certain causeways in Point Judith Pond is moving forward at the Harbor Island causeway.

I would also like to take this opportunity to bring the councils attention to our town liaison Jill Sabo whose help has been immeasurable.

Narragansett Land Conservancy Trust

Annual Report – 2018

Overview / Support

The Land Conservancy Trust (“Trust”) is organized under the provisions of Division 3 of the Town Charter

Section 2-101. – Established; purpose

1. Acquiring land, development rights and easements within the town, affording priority to environmentally sensitive lands;
2. Preserving open spaces, farmlands, scenic vistas, wetlands, estuaries, adjoining uplands and critical habitats;
3. Preserving land providing access to coastal waters; and
4. Preserving land for future public recreational and educational use

In addition, Section 2-105 (5) gives the Trust the responsibility to “Administer and manage land and interests in land held by it in a manner which allows public use and/or enjoyment consistent with the natural, historic and scenic resources of such land.” Under this provision, the Trust is responsible for the Middlebridge property and the Sunset Farm / Kinney Bungalow properties.

The Trust is supported by the Community Development department. The Parks & Recreation department oversees the day-to-day operation of these properties.

Land Acquisition

- To acquire a significant group of privately held parcels, working with DEM, submitted a grant application to the USFWS Coastal Wetland Conservation Fund. Submitted a letter to the RIDEM Land Acquisition committee. Received letters of support from Salt Pond Coalition, The Nature Conservancy, Save the Bay, et al.
- Completed a detailed review of all parcels within the Green Belt and identified possible parcels for further consideration. Develop a set of working criteria to be used to prioritize parcels using the acquisition criteria as a starting point for the next steps.
- Accepted a donation of two parcels from the Armenian Education Foundation.
- Approached RIDOT to acquire 7.25 acres of state property on Boston Neck Road (N-1-10)

Existing Properties

Middlebridge Conservation Land

- In accordance with the Middlebridge Management Plan approved on December 18, 2017, worked with town staff to prepare a building repair Request for Proposal (RFP) and a Request of Interest (ROI) for any non-residential which would be interested in renting from the Town. No entity responded to the ROI. Town staff prepared a recommendation to renovate 95 and 95D Middlebridge Road (“yellow building” and “marina building”, respectively) and to demolish the three cottages, 95 A, B and C. On August 6, the Town Council approved the renovation of the two buildings but did not approve the demolition on a 2/3 vote. The status of these three buildings remain in limbo since acquisition in 2012.

- Under the direction of Professor Richard Sheridan, the junior class of the URI Landscape Architecture program studied the Middlebridge waterfront and prepared recommendations.
- Also, in accordance with the Middlebridge Management plan, the Trust convened a group of conservation stakeholders and experts to include the Narrow River Preservation Association, the Narrow River Land Trust, the US Fish and Wildlife Service, the Narragansett Conservation Commission and Save the Bay. As a result of this collaborative effort, the Conservation Plan was prepared and approved by the Trust on October 18, 2018 and by the Town Council on December 3, 2018.

Sunset Farm

- Working with town staff and a town council member, updated a set of expectations for the management of Sunset Farm to be in compliance with the lease. This effort essentially repeated a similar effort conducted in early 2017.
- Filed a formal complaint with the Town Manager about the accumulation of discarded equipment and building materials on the property.
- Reviewed and approved a recommendation to the Planning Board on July 19, 2018 for the rezoning of Sunset Farm to be in compliance with the Town Comprehensive Plan. Updated this recommendation and resubmitted it to the Planning Board on October 18, 2018.
- In response to several questions about the accessibility of the public to the public trails on Sunset Farm, members of the Trust toured the trails with Susan Buonanno, Mike Deluca, and Jeff Farrell, the tenant farmer, on June 21, 2018. During the subsequent Trust meeting on June 21, 2018, three trustees volunteered to work on developing a plan to open up the trails to the public
- On July 30, 2018 while walking on the public trails at Sunset Farm, these three trustees were accosted by Mr. Farrell, the tenant farmer, who called the police charging that the trustees were trespassing. Several articles in the press resulted.
- On August 16, 2018, the Trust reviewed and approved a plan to open the trails to the public.
- As of the end of the year, the trust has been requested to stay off of Sunset Farm since around August until a remediation plan can be agreed to for damage done by Mr. Farrell to Town conservation land adjacent to Sunset Farm. The trails remain inaccessible to the public.

Trails

- Preliminary designs of Trust trail markers were discussed. Two levels of designs were discussed as well as a plan to identify locations at trail heads for Trust properties at Sunset Farm, Harbour Island and Crooked Brook.
- Preliminary discussion were held about the possibility of connecting all Town trails from Canonchet to Harbour Island.

Kinney Bungalow

- On April 10, 2018, the Town Council did not approve the installation of a \$400,000 HVAC system for Kinney Bungalow on a 2 to 3 vote. The Trust had approved a recommendation to the Town Council on Analyzed the proposed \$400k HVAC system and recommended installation on a 6-3 vote of trustees on July 20, 2017.

Administrative

- Established a new Trust web presence within the Town web site. Current information about Trust properties have been added; links to other sites about trails in the region are planned. The web presence has been coordinated with Town.
- Several trustees attended the annual Land and Water Conservation Summit at URI
- The Trust supported the ballot item for Open Space bonds.
- The Trust recommended to the Town Council to approve a resolution protecting the independence of municipal land trusts in the state, subsequent to a legislative proposal to acquire the Smithfield Land Trust properties. The Town Council approved this resolution on July 12, 2018. Met with the RI Land Trust Alliance, trustees of other land trusts and the RIAG office to discuss means to protect public conservation land to preclude a reoccurrence of this legislative proposal.
- The Trust had a tent at the Environmental Awareness Day at the Town Beach on July 14, 2018.
- The Trust participated in 'Gansett Days to a limited extent.
- Members of the Trust participate in two public meetings on the RI Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP) update.

Meetings, Membership and Attendance

During the year, no changes to trustees occurred. Attendance of trustees is shown in the attached table.

A motion was made by Brian Wagner, duly seconded by Jerry Brunetto, to approve the Annual Report.

That motion passed 7-0. (Thomas Rogers, Terence Fleming, Sue Bush, Brian Wagner, Jason Colonies, Jerry Brunetto, Pati Sylvia; Jill Lawler and Jesse Pugh were not in attendance)



Town of Narragansett – Municipal Library Annual Report

2018 picked up where the previous year ended... with work to obtain and renovate property for a new library. The Library Board has been diligently pursuing the acquisition of a safe, code compliant Library building since 2008, and after many false starts and delays the former Belmont building was purchased as the new library site in October 2018. The next step is to choose an architect, get a cost estimate, file for OLIS reimbursement (Grant in Aid for libraries construction is up to 50% of the costs) and start the building project. However, as of December 31, 2018, the Town Council has stymied the issuance of the RFP for architectural services, and so the project has hit yet another delay.

The Maury Loontjens Memorial Library is a municipal library of the Town of Narragansett.

The Library has been a Town department since 1987, when the Town purchased the building and the private association that served as the Town library. An ordinance was passed by the Town Council in 1990 that granted full time employees of the Library Town pension and benefits, and since that date employees were hired and included in the Town roster as employees. All employees of the Library receive checks with the Town of Narragansett listed as the employer, and the Employer Identification Number (EIN) is the one that belongs to the Town. The Library, being a municipal library, has no other tax ID or entity. In November 2017, and in the early part of 2018, 2 new full time employees were hired to replace 2 employees who had found other jobs. Both employees were promised the benefits and pension that the other current full time employees of the Library receive. In April of 2018, at the public Budget Workshop for the Library budget, the increase in pension contributions were discussed with no negative comments. On June 18, 2018 a Town Councilor alleged that the MLM Library is a private library, and used this as a reason to deny pensions to the newest employees. In an August 6 Town Council meeting, a motion instructed the Town Solicitor and Finance Director to offer some form of retirement account to the Library employees who are working without promised benefits.

As of December 31, 2018, no retirement plan has been offered.

In the coming year of 2019, the Library will continue to offer the many programs, events and workshops that make us so popular with our community. The Library will continue to provide opportunities for residents to enrich their lives and provide access to technology they would otherwise might not be able to afford or experience on their own.

The MLM Library in Narragansett is a warm and inviting place valued very highly by the residents of the Town. A well trained and friendly staff, supportive Trustees, enthusiastic Friends of the Library, and diverse group of supporters and patrons all contribute to making the Library the true "living room of the community ". In this coming year, we will move forward to complete our move to a larger, state of the art library space, that will allow us to serve more of our wonderful community.

2018 PLANNING BOARD ANNUAL REPORT

OVERVIEW

The following report provides a description of the key accomplishments of the Department of Community Development for the 2018 calendar year. By extension, it also addresses the actions of the Planning Board (as required under RIGL 45-22-8). The Department of Community Development also provides administrative support to the Zoning Board of Review, the Historic District Commission, the Conservation Commission/Tree Board, the Land Conservancy Trust and the Harbor Management Commission. Their annual reports are drafted and submitted separately.

STAFF RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

Organizationally, the Community Development Staff has the following primary duties:

DIRECTOR – Provides administrative supervision of all staff activities; Drafts, reviews, and updates selected provisions of the town Comprehensive Plan; Drafts and reviews proposals for zoning text and map changes; Reviews and reports to Planning Board on subdivisions and land development projects; Assists the Historic District Commission to review and comment on historic building repairs; Attends all meetings of Town Council, Planning Board and Historic District Commission and several meetings of others boards noted above.

ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING SPECIALIST – Focuses the majority of work hours on two primary duties: conducts Environmental Planning Projects and oversees the use, expansion, and improvement of the Towns GIS mapping system. Serves as liaison to other departments (Fire, Assessor, Finance etc.) to aid in their use of GIS; Works with the general public in regards to FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map determinations, policy, and building requirements; Assists with the management of the Town website and provides technical support to Town staff as needed. Oversees work of the Planning Technician to provide direct staffing support to the Planning and Zoning Boards by conducting and reporting on Site Reviews scheduled for public hearing; Aids the public in determining submittal requirements for Special Use Permits and Variances; Works closely with the Planning Technician and CD Administrative Assistant to arrange proper scheduling for each public hearing. The Environmental Planning Specialist is responsible for drafting and/or assisting with policy and regulatory plans including the Rules of Procedure for various boards, the Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Middlebridge Master Plan.

PLANNING TECHNICIAN - Provides support to the Director & the Environmental Planning Specialist by reviewing building plans and zoning applications to ensure compliance with regulations; drafts resulting reports of review for Historic District Reviews, Staff Reviews, and Site Reviews for relief, provides administrative staffing to various boards and commissions as assigned by the Director, drafting of decision letters, preparing public notices and agendas and creating visuals including maps, charts, tables and other graphics for use at Planning and Zoning Board meetings. Conducts Planning Board package preparation, drafting of Planning & Zoning Board agendas and advertisements, and other office tasks as assigned. Works closely with the public on a regular basis to provide customer service to understand planning and zoning processes. The Planning Technician assists with historic district expansion analysis by drafting of GIS maps for use by the HDC as well as taking part in public meetings and workshops.

CD ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT – Provides direct assistance to Director, Environmental Planning Specialist, and Planning Technician for daily work requirements including appointment setting and follow-up; Routes all walk-ins and telephone calls to the appropriate staff member; responsible for completing weekly payroll; responsible for ordering of all needed office supplies and maintaining detailed records of all Purchase Orders; responsible for daily mail pick-up and distribution; responsible for management of budgetary needs as it relates to financial allotments for each fiscal year; Serves as primary manager of CDBG files and works closely with the Staff of Washington County Community Development Corporation to manage payments to sub-recipients; Carries out all documentary tasks related to assembling annual CDBG request; Serves as Clerk of the Planning Board, Zoning Board and Historic District Commission; Provides administrative support relative to scheduling of meetings, receipt of applications, oversight for completeness, setting and posting of agendas, attendance at hearings and drafting of minutes.

2018 KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- A. HISTORIC PRESERVATION** – Director, Planning Technician and CD Administrative Assistant worked closely with the Historic District Commission members to pursue expansion of historic districts from 150 regulated properties to 400+ properties. This year the staff worked closely with the HDC and Town Council to schedule public hearings for consideration of the proposed new/expanded districts. Town Council approved expansion of Central Street District and establishment of new Narragansett Avenue Historic District on March 19, 2018. In the coming year HDC will request funds to draft and distribute an informational brochure to all newly regulated properties.
- B. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)** – Director coordinated the submittal of an \$115,000 CDBG application in May, 2018. This year’s grant request was to fund the St. Peter’s Church food pantry, to assist the Domestic Violence Resource Center and to subsidize the Tri-County Community Action Agency’s child care facility. In July, the Town was notified that it received an award of \$61,354 to assist the DVRC and Tri-County CAP. WCCDC is managing these grant contracts on behalf of the Town.
- C. GIS IMPROVEMENTS** – General improvements to GIS data are continually made and data is updated in an effort to provide more accurate and accessible information. In the autumn of 2018, the Town went live with the online Mapping Tool (GIS) hosted by MapGeo. This tool is invaluable for users interested in identifying property in Town as it relates to local, state and federal mapped information e.g., wetlands, flood zones, historic districts, etc. Staff will revise and update the scope for Phase II for implementation in 2019.
- D. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENTS** – Staff initiated rezoning of parcels that were mismatched between the Comprehensive Plan Land Use Map and the current Zoning Maps. Ten lots comprising nine parcels were identified and considered for re-zoning by the Planning Board. In November, 2018 the Planning Board made recommendations to the Town Council identifying the appropriate zones for each of the target parcels to be given. Public hearing on 3 of the 9 sites is scheduled in February, 2019.
- E. HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN** – The Environmental Planning Specialist has been working closely with the Local Hazard Mitigation Committee to update the Action Items and to revise the Towns Risk Assessment Matrix. In October, 2018, we hired the firm of Weston & Sampson to aid staff and the Committee to finalize the framework and format of the new Plan. Final Plan was recommended for approval by the Planning Board in late November and approved by Town Council on December 3, 2018. On December 14, 2018, FEMA responded to the Town that the drafted Plan was “approved pending adoption”. On January

7, 2019, Town Council adopted the Plan. The Town anticipates formal approval by FEMA before the end of January, 2019.

- F. SITE REVIEW/STAFF REVIEW APPLICATIONS** – During the 2018 calendar year, the Department of Community Development received and processed thirty (30) Staff Review applications and thirty-seven (37) Site Review applications for Planning Board and Zoning Board review.
- G. ADOPT-A-SPOT** – During the 2018 calendar year, the Planning Technician has continued to work with the Conservation Commission in managing and expanding the Adopt-a-Spot program.
- H. ZONING AMENDMENTS** – The Community Development Department periodically reviews the Town’s Zoning Ordinance to consider changes in text that may relate to other regulatory provisions or need clarification in light of a real world experience. In 2018 staff proposed text and map revisions in the following sections:
- a. Section 3.2 – Zoning Map – Town-sponsored change of zones for nine sites throughout town that must be corrected to comply with the Comprehensive Plan / Land Use Map. Action pending in 2019.
 - b. Sections 11.3 and 22.1 – Notifications law was amended to allow for use of PS Form 3817 to comply with “certification” requirement for notification to abutters of zone variance and zone change applications. Approved in Oct.
 - c. Section 7.1 – Urban Renewal Zone – Staff drafted text and mapping for rezoning of a parcel of land (pending subdivision) to allow for public uses; specifically a library, in the former Belmont Building in Pier Village. Approved in October.
 - d. Section 11 and 12 – Standards for consideration of variances and special use permits – staff drafted text revisions to improve the standards to apply to variances and special use permits to better comply with State Law in RIGL 45-24. Approved in September.
 - e. Section 6.4 Dimensional Regulations (height) – Staff drafted a revision to the measurement of height specifically for properties located in flood zones. This was done in response to changes made to the State law defining “height” passed by the General Assembly in Spring, 2018. Action pending by Town Council in 2019.
 - f. Section 3.2 Zoning Map – 1007 Boston Neck Road – Staff drafted an ordinance codifying an approved zone change to the property located at 1007 Boston Neck Road in April 2017. This ordinance was inadvertently overlooked last year. The first reading was approved in December. Adoption pending in January, 2019.
 - g. Section 7.7 – Supplementary Drainage requirements – Staff drafted text revisions to this section that would provide clear connection between Town regulations and State stormwater requirements. Draft is under internal review. Possible action in 2019.
 - h. Section 3.2 – Zoning Map – Staff assisted in drafting an ordinance that would re-zone the Sunset Farm Property from R-80 residential to P- Public. This action was tabled by Town Council.
 - i. Section 18.3 – Site Plan Submission and Review – Staff drafted a short revision to the subsection allowing expert assistance to expand the list of technical areas of expertise that may be requested by the Planning or Zoning Board. Approved in August.

Staff is also in the process of reviewing two private applications for zone changes; Boon Street Special District and Church allowance in BB-Business zones. Both of these applications have been submitted by private individuals seeking changes to the text of the Zoning Ordinance that may be applied beyond their own properties. As of December 31st these ordinances are pending review and recommendation from the Planning Board to Town Council.

- I. BIKE PATH EXPANSION** – In 2018 the Director renewed the Town’s request for RIDOT to transfer the management and funding for Section 4B of the William C. O’Neill Bike Path to the Town. The contract agreement pending for the transfer of Section 4B has been put on hold while the RIDOT staff and consultant (VHB) conduct a “readiness analysis” of the project. Staff received the first draft of the “Readiness Report” in December and has commented on it to RIDOT. Finalization and further action toward initiation of design under Town control is pending in 2019.

RIDOT has already transferred Section 4A to the Town and design work by DiPrete Engineering is nearly complete. Construction is expected in Spring 2019.

Safe Routes to School multi-use path project is progressing toward finalization of design with McMahon Associates. Wetland application for crossing of stream between the NHS ballfield and Central Street is pending in January, 2019. Construction is expected in Spring 2019.

- J. FIREFIGHTER EXHIBIT AT SC MUSEUM** – The Director has continued working with representatives of the South County Museum, the Narragansett Lions Club and the RI Dept. of Environmental Management to pursue State authorization to build a new Firefighter Museum Exhibit at the South County Museum. Staff is continuing to investigate alternative “6f conversion” replacement sites with RIDEM staff. Should a new site avail itself town staff will renew efforts to gain state and federal authorization to convert the SC Museum to remove the federal regulations clearing the way for the process for approval to proceed
- K. ‘GANSETT DAYS MAPPING** – For the fourth year in a row, Staff has assisted the Parks & Recreation Department by preparing a Town-Wide Map of all the activities scheduled over the three-day event. The mapping included providing Q-R coding so that participants could interactively use the map to locate a particular event to attend. The Map was prominently displayed at the Event’s main location at Gazebo Park for use by residents and visitors alike.
- L. HARBOR MANAGEMENT PLAN** – During the 2018 calendar year, the staff continued to act as a liaison to the Harbor Management Commission and has assisted the Commission in updating the Town’s Harbor Management Plan. Staff has worked closely with the Coastal Resource Management Council (CRMC) and the Town Solicitor to ensure the revisions are consistent with State laws and CRMC policies and guidelines. The Harbor Management Plan was adopted by the Town in 2016 and received state approval in 2018 after a short list of final revisions were made by Town Council at the State’s request.

2019 OUTLOOK

In addition to the projections of staff activity noted in the highlights above, this department anticipates initiating /continuing work on the following projects and programs:

1. PRIMARY OBJECTIVES

- A. *Zoning Map Update*: Complete action to bring Zoning Maps up to date with Comprehensive Plan.
- Oversee the process of advancing the revised proposal for re-zoning nine (9) properties through the Town Council hearing process.
- B. *Zoning Ordinance Text Update*: Continue actions to update the Zoning Ordinance to correct errors, clarify components or include additional language to assist the Town in regulating development in town.
- Work with Staff, Planning Board and interested parties to make edits to the Ordinance. Present changes to Town Council in 2 to 3 segments
 - i. Section 6 – Height of Structures – Continue to work with the planning Board and Town Council to adopt new language for height restrictions in areas affected by coastal flooding.
 - ii. Section 7.7 – Supplementary Drainage Regulations – Complete the process of drafting an ordinance to improve this section in compliance with State regulations.
 - iii. Section 6.1 – Schedule of uses – Complete regulation for churches in BB-Business Zones
 - iv. Section 4.8.2 – Boon Street Regulations – Complete Town staff review and recommendation to Planning Board and Town Council addressing possible new regulations for the Boon Street Special District as requested by M. Vickers.

Work closely with consultant engineers and Town staff (Engineering, DPW, and School Dept.) to advance the targeted capital improvements.
- *TIP roadway projects:* Work with RIDOT staff to transfer roadway improvements project for South Pier Road, and others to Town control and management.

F. Canonchet Farm:

- Work with Friends of Canonchet Farm to advance the design for the Linear Park component and seek appropriate permits from RIDOT and CRMC to approve construction in the near future.
- Revisit the possibility of South County Museum and Narragansett Lions Club coordinated project to complete the “6f conversion” to eliminate federal regulatory requirements and enable the construction of a Fireman’s Exhibit Hall.

G. Historic District Expansion: Staff will work with the HDC to draft and distribute an informational brochure to all owners of property recently added to the regulated districts. Other related tasks include working with the HDC to initiate an Awards Program and to seek legislative assistance in finalizing the necessary changes in State Law to authorize implementation of the local Tax Credit Ordinance.

H. Trails: Continue work on permitting for the trail entrance on South Pier Road with RIDEM staff. Coordinate work with DPW on the trail entrance construction once State permit is in hand. Also, assist the Land Conservancy Trust in design and implementation of enhancement to the Sunset Farm Trails to make them available to the public without impact to farming operations.

NARRAGANSETT ZONING BOARD OF REVIEW 2018 ANNUAL REPORT

OVERVIEW

The Zoning Board of Review is empowered to hear and decide appeals, to grant special use permits, use variances and dimensional variances, in accordance with the specific provisions called out in the Narragansett Zoning Ordinance under RIGL 45-24 et seq. The members of this Board also serve as the Narragansett Platting Board of Review and the Building Code of Appeals. The following report provides a description of the Board's key accomplishments for the 2018 calendar year.

SUPPORT STAFF

The Zoning Board is supported by the Building Inspections Office and the Department of Community Development through administrative staff. Organizationally, the Building Inspections Office staff consists of six employees - the Building/Zoning Official, the Assistant Building Inspector, two (2) part-time Community Housing Officers, the Building Inspection Clerk and a Rental Registration Clerk. The Community Development staff consists of four employees – the Director, the Environmental Planning Specialist, the Planning Technician and the Administrative Assistant. Each staff person in the Community Development office provides some level of assistance to the Zoning Board with application review.

2018 KEY HIGHLIGHTS

RESIDENTIAL IMPROVEMENTS – The Zoning Board heard 31 separate applications for single family developments – new construction, additions or demolition/rebuild. Of those applicants, 28 were approved and 3 were continued to 2019.

COMMERCIAL IMPROVEMENTS – The Zoning Board heard and approved 6 commercial projects in 2018. Pet Supplies Plus was approved for non-conforming signage at the Salt Pond Plaza, the Atlantic House was approved for a small lobby addition, the property presented by Salvatore & Sons was granted a Special Use Permit for a lunchroom with alcoholic beverages and Aunt Carrie's was granted approval to enlarge their kitchen to accommodate new equipment. On Boon Street, two properties were granted relief, one currently has a mix of uses including two residential and a small business, and the applicant was granted an amendment to the Site Plan to reorient the parking. The other application is immediately adjacent and owned by the same applicant, and was previously granted rights to the non-conforming use of three dwelling units. The most recent application in 2018 was to include three commercial units on the site as well as the three dwelling units; the application was approved.

APPEALS – In their alternate capacity as noted above, the Board heard several appeals. Most notable were the Platting Board appeals for Clarke Road Subdivision – a 5-lot Subdivision, and The Boon Street Presbyterian, LLC appeal, a 4-unit, market rate master plan development. The Clarke Road application was approved with conditions by the Planning Board and appealed by an interested party, and the Boon Street Presbyterian, LLC development was denied by the Planning Board and appealed by the owner/applicant. The Platting Board of Review upheld the decision of the Planning Board in both appeals.

In addition, the Zoning Board of Review reversed the determination of the Building Official in one commercial application thereby allowing the applicant to grow and cultivate plants for sale.

Report on the Basic Financial Statements

I have audited the accompanying basic financial statements of the Town of Narragansett Housing Authority, which comprise the statement of net assets as of June 30, 2017, and the related statements of revenues, expenses and changes in net assets, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the basic financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Basic Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these basic financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of basic financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these basic financial statements based on my audit. My audit was performed for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying supplementary information includes the combining statement of net assets - financial data schedule, the combining statement of revenues and expenses - financial data schedule, as required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and the schedule of expenditures of federal awards as required by Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance), *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations*, and are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*. In my opinion, the information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements taken as whole.

As the management of the Town of Narragansett Housing Authority, we offer readers of the Authority's financial statements this narrative overview and analysis of the financial activities of the Authority for the year ended June 30, 2017. We encourage readers to consider the information presented here in conjunction with the Authority's financial statements.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The net assets of the Authority at the close of the most recent fiscal year was \$340,009.

The Authority had intergovernmental revenues of \$1,521,099 from HUD grants. An increase of \$150,863 from the previous year due to an increase in Housing Choice Voucher income.

Restricted nets assets decreased by \$8,885.

OVERVIEW OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements included in this annual report are those of a special-purpose government engaged only in a business-type activity. The following statements are included:

Statement of Net Assets - reports the Authority's current financial resources (short-term spendable resources) with capital assets and long-term debt obligations.

Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Fund Nets Assets - reports the Authority's operating and non-operating revenues, by major source along with operating and non-operating expenses and capital contributions.

Statement of Cash Flows - reports the Authority's cash flows from operating investing, capital and non-capital activities.

Program budgets for the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) funds are approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on a basis consistent with the grant applications covering HAP Programs.

The Authority's net assets are committed to the funds in which they were created. All funds have some restrictions placed upon their net assets. Low-Rent Public Housing's net assets are designated for operations, major repairs and capitalized improvements not provided by Capital Fund Programs. Section Eight net assets may be used for other housing purposes requiring the Authority's Board of Commissioners' approval.

ECONOMIC FACTORS

The Authority expects the financial position of the Authority to improve. Occupancy rates continue to remain extremely high and the Authority's absence of long-term debt do not leave it financially vulnerable to a widely anticipated increase in long-term interest rates or problems in the credit market.

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization - The Town of Narragansett Housing Authority was organized in accordance with the housing statutes of the State of Rhode Island. The Authority was organized to provide low-income housing. The governing body of the Authority consists of a Chairperson and a Board of Commissioners. The Authority is not considered a component unit of the town.

Reporting Entity - In evaluating the Town of Narragansett Housing Authority as a reporting entity, management has addressed all potential component units for which the Authority may or may not be financially accountable and, as such, be includable within the Authority's general purpose financial statements. In accordance with GASB Statement #14, the Authority is required to consider other entities for which the nature and significance of their relationship are such that exclusion would cause the reporting entity's financial statements to be misleading or incomplete. Therefore, the financial statements of the Authority include in addition to its Low Income Housing Assistance Program, a Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program, a Public Housing Capital Fund Program and a Family Self-sufficiency Program. These programs are financed by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Income Taxes - The Town of Narragansett Housing Authority is a non-profit corporation and is not subject to federal or state income taxes.

Cash and Cash Equivalents - The Authority considers repurchase agreements and money market accounts with a maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

Inventories - Inventories in the general fund consist of expendable supplies held for the Authority's use and are carried at cost using the first-in, first-out method.

Basis of Accounting - The Authority utilizes the accrual basis of accounting. For financial reporting purposes the Authority follows the pronouncements of the Government Accounting Standard Board. In accordance with GASB Statement No. 20, in the absence of specific guidance from GASB pronouncements, pronouncements of the Financial Accounting Standard Board issued on or before November 30, 1989 have been followed.

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continues)

Investments - Investments are stated at fair value as required by GASB Statement No.31. Short-term investments are valued at cost which approximates fair value.

Revenue Recognition - The statement of net assets and the statement of income, expenses and changes in net assets of the Authority are presented on the accrual basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when liabilities are incurred without regard to receipt or disbursement of cash. The Authority distinguishes operating revenues and expenses from nonoperating items. Operating revenues and expenses generally result from providing services and producing and delivering goods in connection with the Authority's principal ongoing operations. The principal operating revenues of the Authority are rental revenue, charges for services and intergovernmental operating grants. Operating expenses for the Authority include the cost of services, administrative expenses, housing assistance payments and depreciation on capital assets. All revenues and expenses not meeting this definition are reported as nonoperating revenues and expenses.

Accrued Compensated Absences - The Authority records accumulated unpaid vacation and associated employee-related costs as the benefits accrue to the employee.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Capital Assets - Capital assets are stated at cost. Ordinary maintenance and repair expenses are charged directly to operations as incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets. Upon retirement or other disposition of capital assets the cost and related depreciation are removed from the program accounts. Any gain or loss is included in the Program's current year operations. The Authority defines capital assets with an initial cost of more than \$500 and an estimated life of at least three years.

Subsequent Events - The Housing Authority has evaluated events through March 16, 2018; which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Pensions - In accordance with GASB #68, for purposes of measuring the net pension liability (asset), deferred outflows of resources and deferred inflows of resources related to pensions, and pension expense, information about the fiduciary net position of the Municipal Employees' Retirement System (MERS) of Rhode Island and additions to/deductions from MERS' fiduciary net position have been determined on the same basis as they are reported by MERS. For this purpose, benefit payments (including refunds of employee contributions) are recognized when due and payable in accordance with the benefit terms. Investments are reported at fair value.

Note 4 - Cash, Cash Equivalents and Investments

At June 30, 2017, the carrying amount of the Authority's deposits was \$128,104. As of June 30, 2017, \$0 of deposits were exposed to custodial credit risk, because of the FDIC insurance of \$250,000.

The Authority's deposits are categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the Authority at year end.

Category 1 - includes deposits that are insured or registered or for which the securities are held by the Authority or its agent in the Authority's name.

Category 2 - includes uninsured and unregistered deposits for which the securities are held by the counterparty's trust department or agent in the Authority's name.

Category 3 - includes uninsured and unregistered deposits for which the securities are held by the counterparty, or by its trust department or agent but not in the Authority's name.

Note 5 - Budgeting and Budgetary Control

An annual budget is adopted on a basis of accounting practices prescribed by HUD, which differs in some respects from generally accepted accounting principles for the general fund and all the other programs. The budget is approved by the Board of Commissioners. The funding portion of the federal budget known as Performance Funding Reports are submitted to and approved by HUD.

Note 6 - Restricted Net Worth

Restricted net worth equals the balance remaining of the excess of funds received by the Authority from HUD for HAP payments less funds expended as of the balance sheet date from December 31, 2005.

Note 7 - Concentration of Risk

The Authority receives most of its funding from HUD. These funds and grants are subject to modification by HUD depending on the availability of funding.

Note 8 - Prior Period Adjustment

The prior period adjustment relates to an adjustment regarding the amount due from H.U.D. from a previous year.

Note 9 - Pension Plan

Plan Description - The Municipal Employees' Retirement System (MERS) - and agent multiple-employer defined benefit pension plan - provides certain retirement, disability and death benefits to plan members and beneficiaries. MERS was established under Rhode Island General Law and placed under the management of the Employee's Retirement System of Rhode Island (ERSRI) Board to provide retirement allowances to employees of municipalities, housing authorities, water and sewer districts, and municipal police and fire persons that have elected to participate. Benefit provisions are subject to amendment by the General Assembly.

MERS issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information. This report may be obtained accessing the ERSRI website at www.ersri.org.

Benefits provided - General employees, police officers and firefighters employed by electing municipalities participate in MERS. Eligible employees become members at their date of employment. Anyone employed by a municipality at the time the municipality joins MERS may elect not to be covered. Elected officials may opt to be covered by MERS. Employees covered under another plan maintained by the municipality may not become members of MERS. Police officers and/or firefighters may be designated as such by the municipality, in which case the special contribution and benefit provisions described below will apply to them, or they may be designated as general employees with no special benefits. Members designated as police officers and/or firefighters are treated as belonging to a unit separate from the general employees, with separate contribution rates applicable.

Salary: Salary includes the member's base earnings plus any payments under a regular longevity or incentive plan. Salary excludes overtime, unused sick and vacation leave, severance pay, and other extraordinary compensation. Certain amounts that are excluded from taxable wages, such as amounts sheltered under a Section 125 plan or amounts picked up by the employer under IRC Section 414(h), are not excluded from salary.

Service: Employees receive credit for service while a member. In addition, a member may purchase credit for certain periods by making an additional contribution to purchase the additional service. Special rules and limits govern the purchase of additional service and the contribution required.

Final Average Compensation (FAC): Prior to July 1, 2012 and for general employee members eligible to retire as of June 30, 2012, the average was based on the member's highest three consecutive annual salaries. Effective July 1, 2012, the average was based on the member's highest five consecutive annual salaries. Once a member retires or is terminated, the applicable FAC will be the greater of the member's highest three year FAC as of July 1, 2012 or the five year FAC as of the retirement/termination date. Monthly benefits are based on one-twelfth of this amount.

Subsequent to June 30, 2015, litigation challenging the various pension reform measures enacted in previous years by the General Assembly (2009, 2010, and 2011) was settled. The final settlement approved by the Court on July 8, 2015 also included enactment of the pension settlement provisions by the General Assembly. These amended benefit provisions, which have been included in the determination of the total pension liability at the June 30, 2015 measurement date and are reflected in the summary of benefit provisions described below.

General employees

Members with less than five years of contributory service as of June 30, 2012 and members hired on or after that date are eligible for retirement on or after their Social Security normal retirement age (SSNRA).

Members who had at least five years of contributory service as of June 30, 2012 will be eligible for retirement at an individually determined age. This age is the result of interpolating between the member's prior Retirement Date, described below, and the retirement age applicable to members hired after June 30, 2012 in (a) above. The interpolation is based on service as of June 30, 2012 divided by projected service at the member's prior Retirement Date. The minimum retirement age is 59.

Members with 10 or more years of contributory service on June 30, 2012 may choose to retire at their prior Retirement Date if they continue to work and contribute until that date. If this option is elected, the retirement benefit will be calculated using the benefits accrued as of June 30, 2012, i.e., the member will accumulate no additional defined benefits after this date, but the benefit will be paid without any actuarial reduction.

Effective July 1, 2015, members will be eligible to retire with full benefits at the earlier of their current Rhode Island Retirement Security Act (RIRSA) date described above or upon the attainment of age 65 with 30 years of service, age 64 with 31 years of service, age 63 with 32 years of service, or age 62 with 33 years of service.

A member who is within five years of reaching their retirement eligibility date and has 20 or more years of service, may elect to retire at any time with an actuarially reduced benefit.

Other benefit provisions

Death and disability benefits are also provided to members. A member is eligible for a disability retirement provided he/she has credit for at least five years of service or if the disability is work-related. Members are not eligible for an ordinary disability benefit if they are eligible for unreduced retirement.

Joint and survivor benefit options are available to retirees. For some employees, a Social Security Option is also available where an annuity is paid at one amount prior to age 62, and at a reduced amount after age 62, designed to provide a level total income when combined with the member's age 62 Social Security benefit. Benefits cease upon the member's death.

Post-retirement benefit increases are paid to members who retire after June 30, 2012. Members will be eligible to receive cost of living increases at the later of the member's third anniversary of retirement and the month following their SSNRA (age 55 for members designated as police officers and/or firefighters). When a municipality elects coverage, it may elect either COLA C (covering only current and future active members and excluding members already retired) or COLA B (covering current retired members as well as current and future active members).

- a.* The COLA may be granted in four-year intervals while the COLA is suspended. The first interim COLA may begin January 1, 2018.
- b.* Effective July 1, 2015, the COLA is determined based on 50% of the plan's five-year average investment rate of return less 5.5% limited to a range of 0.0% to 4.0%, plus 50% of the lesser of 3.0% or last year's CPI-U increase for a total maximum increase of 3.50%. Previously, it was the plan's five-year average investment rate of return less 5.5% limited to a range of 0.0% to 4.0%.
- c.* The COLA will be limited to the first \$25,000 of the member's annual pension benefit. For retirees and beneficiaries who retired on or before July 1, 2015, years in which a COLA is payable based on the every fourth year provision described in (i) above will be limited to the first \$30,000. These limits will be indexed annually to increase in the same manner as COLAs, with the known values of \$25,000 for 2013, \$25,000 for 2014, \$25,168 for 2015, \$25,855 for 2016, and \$26,098 for 2017.

Contributions - The amount of employee and employer contributions have been established under Rhode Island General Law Chapter 45-21. General employees with less than 20 years of service as of June 30, 2012 are required to contribute 1% of their salaries. General employees with more than 20 years of service as of June 30, 2012 are required to contribute 8.25%. The Town of Narragansett Housing Authority contributes at a rate of covered employee payroll as determined by an independent actuary on an annual basis. The General Assembly can amend the amount of these contribution requirements. The Town of Narragansett Housing Authority contributed \$10,192 in the year ended June 30, 2017 which was 5.71% of annual covered payroll.

Net Pension Liability (Asset) - The total pension liability was determined by actuarial valuations performed as of June 30, 2015 and rolled forward to June 30, 2016, using the following actuarial assumptions, applied to all periods included in the measurement leading to the calculation of the net pension asset of \$15,820 at June 30, 2017.

The actuarial assumptions used in the June 30, 2015 valuation rolled forward to June 30, 2016 and the calculation of the total pension liability at June 30, 2015 were consistent with the results of an actuarial experience study performed as of June 30, 2013.

The long-term expected rate of return best-estimate on pension plan investments was determined by the actuary using a building-block method.
